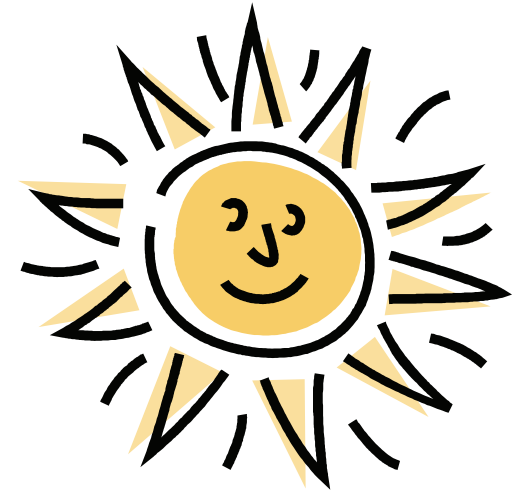

# Classes

Museum summer programs are available June 29 through August 31. Classes are one hour in length, class size limits and age ranges are noted below. The fee per class is \$85, plus travel fee.

**Beautiful Butterflies**                      **Ages 5-11**

Learn about the characteristics of insects and life cycle of the butterfly. Children will participate in a hands on activity using what they have learned.

# Drop-In Activities

The museum also offers creative drop-in activities. The fee is \$120 for the first hour, \$90 for each additional hour.

**Lets Make Bubbles**                                      **All ages**

We bring a variety of bubble-makers and everything it takes to fill the air with shimmering spheres of every imaginable size. Best outdoors!

**Beads Galore**    **Ages 5 and over**

What can you do with beads galore? Make people, animals, or jewelry! Children catch on fast and adults can't resist trying their own designs!

**Popcorn!**    **All ages**

Participants build connections between corn growing on a stalk and the popcorn they eat, using visual and hands on activities.

**Marvelous Masks**                                      **Ages 5 and over**

When you make a mask you create a marvelous character with your imagination. Decorate with markers, feathers, felt and pom-poms.

**Clothespin Creations**                                      **Ages 5 and over**

Create animals, people and all kinds of things from clothespins!

**Quilts of Gee's Bend**                                      **Ages 5 and over**

Quilts from Gee's Bend, Alabama, are famous for their beauty. Quilters used scraps of cloth from old clothes and cotton sacks to make quilts that have been displayed in museums. Make your own quilt using scraps of paper.

**Drop-In activities are ideal for large groups and community gatherings such as fairs and festivals. We bring all the supplies, you provide two 6-foot tables (more tables may be needed for especially large groups).**
